Travel by Jeep through Colombia's fabled Coffee Triangle, and stop to smell the roses of the Ecuadorian highlands. Create with a women's co-op, prepare traditional treats with local chefs, and, of course, surrender to the rhythm of salsa.

Trip Highlights

• Explore Cartagena's exquisite walled center; crisscross the stunning landscapes of Colombia's Coffee Triangle; stroll through Quito's ancient plaza; marvel at the pre-Colombian ruins of Ingapirca; and admire the architectural masterpieces of Cuenca.

• Gather with a women's co-op and create charming crafts; prepare traditional foods with locally grown ingredients; join coffee producers for a bean to brew tour; and take a fun lesson in salsa dancing.

• Hike to a volcano's stunning crater lake; explore the unique landscape of Cotopaxi National Park; learn about rose cultivation at an Andean flower plantation; and traverse a mountain trail among the world's tallest palm trees.

Continue to the famous Gold Museum, with its 55,000 pieces of gold and pre-Hispanic artifacts. Follow cobblestone streets through the historic quarter of La Candelaria to Plaza de Bolivar. Enjoy a tasting-menu lunch at a local avant-garde restaurant, and end your day at the Botero Museum, showcasing Colombia's famous painter and his unique oversized figures.

Day 3

The Coffee Triangle

Fly westward to Pereira for an exploration of The Coffee Triangle, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site. Take a Jeep ride along scenic trails, stopping at a traditional Hacienda and coffee plantation to learn about the cultivation process and taste the rich brews. Help prepare a favorite Latin American snack, patacones, twice-fried green plantains, and enjoy them as you drive to the city of Armenia. Check into your resort hotel with dinner on your own.

Los Nevados National Natural Park

Continue to charming Salento, then on to traditional Filandia with its boldly painted houses and thriving café culture. Participate in a basketry workshop, then return to your hotel with dinner on your own.

Day 5

Fly to Cartagena

Fly from Armenia to beautiful Cartagena. Drive to the nearby fishing village of La Boquilla for a catch-of-the-day lunch. Local women from the Madres—Cabeza de Familia y sus Cocos ("Mothers—Head of the family and their Coconuts") welcome you to their everything-coconut-workshop and craft your own coconut souvenir. Join a unique Bullerengue, a traditional Caribbean music and dance celebration in praise of the sea, earth, and moon.

Bicycle along the turquoise shores of modern Bocagrande, then explore Cartagena's historic center with its hidden plazas, colonial architecture, and overhanging balconies. Trade your cycling helmet for dancing shoes and practice the intricate rhythms of salsa led by a professional instructor. End the day at a local restaurant with your group.
